You've got the power

Never run out of power again with the PowerTrek, the world's first portable water charger. The PowerTrek uses fuel cell technology to convert hydrogen into electricity using as little as a teaspoon of water. Phones, laptops or GPS systems can be charged via the USB port on the device and the only by-product is water vapour. The system is more reliable than traditional solar powered portable chargers as it isn't reliant on the weather. The PowerTrek retails for €199 (about A\$240) and the PowerPukks that facilitate the charging are three euro (about A\$3.60) each. It's not on sale in Australia yet but should be available soon. powertrek.com.au

Pikaia Lodge to open in Galapagos Islands

Pikaia Lodge will open on Santa Cruz island in 2013. It will be the only carbon neutral property in the Galapagos and one of the most advanced eco lodges in the world. Constructed using sustainable materials throughout and recyclable materials where possible, Pikaia Lodge will operate in accordance with the highest specifications of the LEED Certification program (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) from the US Green Building Council and is Ecuador's only member of the prestigious EcoLuxury Retreats. The 12 rooms and two suites are fitted with air conditioning, LED televisions and iPod systems (all of which are of the


highest eco-friendly rating), are bathed in natural light and have views of the Galapagos National Park and the Pacific Ocean. During the day, guests are invited to take part in a number of activities that showcase the spectacular surroundings including the unique wildlife. 


